Safety Instruction Guide for 1911 45ACP Stainless Steel Magazines

Introduction

Thank you for choosing the 1911 45ACP Stainless Steel Magazines. This guide provides essential safety instructions to ensure the safe use and maintenance of your magazine. Instructions for Installation and Usage

1. Installation of Base Pads:

- Choose between the thick and thin base pads provided.
- Using a screwdriver, unscrew the existing base pad from the magazine.
- Align the new base pad with the magazine and secure it using the provided screws.
- Ensure the base pad is firmly attached before use.

2. Loading the Magazine:

- Hold the magazine with the feed lips facing upwards.
- Insert the first round into the magazine, pressing down until it clicks into place.
- Continue loading rounds until the magazine is full (7 rounds maximum).
- Ensure that the rounds are seated correctly.

3. Using the Magazine:

- Insert the loaded magazine into the firearm until it locks into place.
- Always check that the magazine is securely seated before attempting to fire.
- To remove the magazine, press the magazine release button and pull the magazine out gently.

4. Cleaning and Maintenance:

- Regularly clean the magazine to ensure optimal performance.
- Use a soft cloth to wipe down the exterior and a brush for the interior.
- Avoid using harsh chemicals that can damage the finish.

Disposal Instructions

- Dispose of the magazine in accordance with local regulations.
- If the magazine is damaged or no longer functional, do not attempt to repair it.
