Burrs that can cause erratic ignition are often left inside the case at the flash hole during manufacturing. The small tool is for .17 & .20 caliber and cases with small .060" flash holes. This tool does not control the cutting depth. The operator must control the cutting depth using the small pilot stops for 9-64" madrels.
